DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

A. TREASURER'S REPORT – Amy L. Dawson, Fiscal Officer/Cemetery Sexton

TREASURER'S REPORT

As of March 31, we were 1/4 of the way through the calendar year.

The Treasury Balance for the 21 Funds within the Township Treasury was \$7.5 million after posting the 1st Half Real Estate Taxes received late March. The Treasury Balance includes \$2.5 million in funds set aside for specific projects & contracts that will take place in 2011. The rest of the money has been appropriated for general working capital.

Year-to-date expenditures were 14% of the amount appropriated for 2011, so we are well within budget.

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CEMETERY SEXTON'S REPORT

Just a reminder, that as of April 1st every year, plastic flowers and holiday decorations are to be removed. They are allowed between November 1 and March 31. Our Service Department crews will remove any existing artificial flowers and decorations the week of 4/11/11. They will be kept until 4/18 and then disposed of.

In the coming weeks, you will see spring clean up in the cemetery; our new solar light is currently being tested in the Veterans memorial; and two new columbariums will be installed.

B. ADMINISTRATION DEPT. – Jack J. Nettis, Jr., Administrator, discussed flooding & drainage issues:

- **Fairgrounds Rd.** – Spoke to the residents and county offices regarding the yard flooding due to construction.
- **Mountain Park** – Meeting on site April 21st.
- **Waterfowl Way** – Grate fabricated and installed by our Service Dept.
- Meeting weekly with county offices regarding our flooding issues. Weather holding us back.
- Meeting April 15th with Lake County Dept. of Utilities, Lake County Stormwater Management Dept., Concord Service Director Frank Kraska & myself.

It only takes 12 homes with their sump pumps and downspouts tied into the sanitary sewers to overwhelm an 8" sanitary sewer pipe. Residents doing this need to run those lines into their yards.

C. FIRE DEPT. – Deputy Chief Terriaco

April often finds many starting their spring cleaning. The Concord Twp. Fire Dept. would like to encourage our residents as they Spring clean to use this time to Exercise Home Safety!

Have you used too many extension cords over the winter? Limit use to proper circuit cords. Check for frayed or damaged electrical cords and wires and have them repaired or replaced.

Remove accumulation of clutter which may block your means of exit in case of emergencies. Review your fire escape plans and make sure you can GET OUT and STAY OUT.

Keep cleaning fluids stored properly out of the reach of children.

D. SERVICE DEPT. – Frank Kraska, Service Director

To summarize our involvement throughout the winter months: Township crews were dispatched to plow and salt township roads on 77 occasions and distributed approximately a little over 3,000 tons of salt which represented a forty percent decrease based on previous year averages. This decrease can be attributed to our drivers devoted efforts to salt as needed. Not only does this represent economic benefit but also meets our environmental goals as a department.

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We have begun our post winter cleanup of roads which includes the assistance of Lake County who is currently street sweeping curb and gutter roads. Township crews will be repairing areas damaged during snow plow activities and addressing various drainage and erosion concerns which developed during rain events and the combination of rapid thaws following major snow storms. Crews will once again begin participating in road repairs throughout the community.

As a public message we ask that residents who may recognize blockages in drainage ditches or catch basins covered over with debris report these findings to the Concord Service Department at 354-7510 ext: 116.

The annual brush drop-off will take place on May 14th and 21st. Information for this event and other information regarding the disposal of yard waste can be accessed on our website at WWW.CONCORDTWP.COM.

We remind residents to avoid dumping or piling yard waste on the edge of streams or within waterways.

RESOLUTION 2011-11

*Recognizing the Month of April as
Abuse prevention Month, 2011*

Whereas, all children of our community have the right to live and grow in a safe, secure and supportive environment; enter school prepared to succeed; be able to choose healthy behaviors and grow to successful adulthood, and

Whereas, we the Concord Township Board of Trustees acknowledge that those rights are not always available to all of the children and although there has been significant progress to increase the safety and security of our children, we renew our commitment to protecting our most valuable resource, and

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Whereas, Lake County Children Services received over 3,338 calls in 2010 regarding children and their families. As a result, on any given day, Children Services worked with over 500 families who had a variety of problems which could not be resolved with a "quick fix". Throughout 2010, foster families, relatives and other alternative caregivers provided a safe environment for nearly 75 children who were unable to be in their family home, and

Whereas, 76% of the children who died from child abuse in the state of Ohio were under the age of five years old, never having the chance to attend kindergarten. Survivors of child abuse and neglect are at a greater risk for problems later in life such as low academic achievement, drug use, teen pregnancy and criminal behavior affecting not just the child and family but our society as a whole, and

Whereas, the best prevention of child abuse is if both society and individuals take responsibility to offer parents and families the support and tools they need to provide healthy nurturing homes for their children.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Concord Township Board of Trustees, Lake County, Ohio, that we shall declare the month of April as **Child Abuse Prevention Month** in Concord Township and urge citizens of our community to join with us to become involved in activities this month and all through the year to raise awareness of child abuse and to focus our attention on providing safe environments for children and fostering confident, positive parents.
