Since 1972, the mission of the Council on Aging is to keep seniors, 60 and over, who reside in Lake County, in their homes longer where they feel most comfortable and safe along with offering support to their families and caregivers. This provides aging adults and their support system with services and opportunities for them to achieve an optimal, self-defined, quality of life. Programs for those 60 and older include information and referral, case management, nutrition services, and in-home safety and homemaker services.

H.E.L.P.

The agency also has a H.E.L.P. program (Health Equipment Lending Program) that loans walkers, bedside commodes, tub seats and other durable supplies to any senior in Lake County who needs them. The agency welcomes donations to this program of gently used, clean equipment.

40 and Over

The agency also offers several programs for those 40 and over who may live in Lake County or surrounding communities. These programs include employment services and computer education.
