The Joey Tomsick Orchestra won Band of the Year and Recording of the Year at the 22nd Annual Awards Ceremony presented by the National Cleveland Style Polka Hall of Fame and Museum. TENNIS CAMP

Ages 7 to 10

Coach Paul Engel has taught tennis for over 34 years. He has coached at Willoughby South and Harvey High School for a combination of 18 years. Coach Engel is a full-time physical education teacher at Chestnut Elementary in Painesville City.



Tennis Camp is held at Concord Hills Park located on Hoose Road. Two levels of Tennis will be taught for children ages 7 through 10. Level I is for beginners and they will learn basic grips, forehand, backhand, serve, scoring, and net play. Level II is for those students with basic experience. Students in Level II will work on improving forehand and backhand, volley, and serve consistency. Students must provide their own tennis racquets.

In a Kindermusik Sign & Sing class (developed by Signing Smart™), we give parents the tools and knowledge to communicate with their hearing babies using American Sign Language. Through songs and play, both parents and babies learn signs for words like "mommy" and "eat," as well as practical signs like "more," "milk," and "all done." **Material fee of \$35 payable to instructor the first day of class. COMMITTEE HELP NEEDED

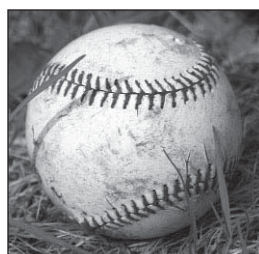
